Purpose: This report seeks approval for the Executive Member for Planning and Development to attend 'Making Garden Communities, Great Communities' Conference which is being held at St-Martin-in-the-fields, Trafalgar Square, London on 24 May 2018.

Executive Summary:

The Government is encouraging the development of new 'Garden Villages, Towns and Cities'. But what does it mean to be a 'garden' community? What are the Garden City Principles and how can they be applied in today's political and economic context? What is the significance of the proposed removal of reference to Garden City principles in the draft revised National Planning Policy Framework?

This conference will include speakers from a wider range of places already working hard to create high quality new places inspired by the Garden City Principles and will benefit anyone thinking about, or already embarked on the process, whether they are councillors, planners, developers, or member of local communities.
