Supporting Information

Background

- 1. Fielder Drive runs parallel to and to the east of Newgate Lane, linking Davis Way and Sharlands Road. The premises in this part of Fareham are primarily commercial rather than residential.
- Leading off Fielder Drive itself, is a small unadopted service road (also known as Fielder Drive), which is owned by Fareham Borough Council (FBC). Complaints have been received by FBC's Estates Department, as landlords, that obstructive parking is taking place which makes if difficult to access premises at the far end of this cul de sac.
- 3. Discussions with the Estates Department have led to a proposal to prohibit parking at all times along the southern side of this service road, as shown on the drawing at Appendix A.
- 4. Parking habitually takes place along the northern side of this road which is acceptable, but sometimes it also happens along the southern side, and this is what leads to the obstructions. Double yellow lining already exists along both sides of the main part of Fielder Drive

Consultations

- 5. The Ward Councillors, County Councillor and Police have been consulted on this proposal and no-one has raised any objections.
- 6. The Statutory Consultees were consulted and no objections were received.

7. The proposal was advertised in December 2014 and no objections were received.
