Executive summary:

Burr ridge Cricket Club (Colts) has requested funding of £2,000 to purchase bowling machine equipment.

The Colts Section has gone from strength to strength and now has over 100 children playing cricket from the beginning of January through to the end of August. Their U9, 11, 13 and 15 teams play in the South East Hants Cricket Leagues and have done exceptionally well over the last few years. Some of the children have got into the district teams throughout this period and also enter and compete at the Ageas Bowl in summer competitions.

The adult teams have been very successful in recent years and the first team played in the regional cup final at the Ageas Bowl in 2013. The Colts Section is used as a feeder for young talent going into adult cricket and the adult teams.

The Colts Section is in desperate need of equipment this year so that they can continue to provide quality coaching and cricket for local children, who come from areas such as Whiteley, Botley, Locks Heath and Hedge End etc. The club also require a bowling machine so that they can develop batting skills. The sum of £2000 is required so that the club can purchase this equipment.

Councillor S Woodward, the Executive Leader supports the application, Councillor D Swanbrow, Ward Councillor supports the application and Madam Mayor Councillor S Bayford the Western Wards Community Action Team Chairman also supports the application .

Anthony Thurgood of Warsash Sailing Club (Sea Cadets) has requested funding of £4,000 to purchase one off accreditation to become a recognised training centre.

In order for Adult Volunteers at Warsash Sailing Club to deliver and certificate Royal Yachting Association (RYA) Power Boat, Dinghy Sailing and Keelboat Sailing training to the 62 cadets at the unit, not only do they need RYA qualified instructors (they have several among our number) but they need to be a Recognised Training Centre (RTC) with the Royal Yachting Association. At present the club is not an RYA RTC and the barrier to them becoming one and offering this training to 10-18 year olds from the local community is purely a financial one.

Councillor T Cartwright, Ward Councillor and Deputy Leader supports this application, Councillor M Ford supports the application and Madam Mayor Councillor Mrs S Bayford chairman of Western Wards CAT meeting supports the application.
