Purpose:

This report presents an application for funding under the Council's Community Fund Programme.

Executive Summary:

Jack Griffiths has requested £4,998 for the purchase of roller hockey equipment.

Jack is a pupil of Cams Hill School who is being supported by Mr Setti Mulari in setting up a new roller hockey team for local young people. The team would be called the Solent Lizards U-14s and would be part of the Solent Sports Club. The club already has four roller hockey teams of adults and juniors who play the sport at Solent Arena, a sports venue run by Mr Mulari on Standard Way, Fareham.

The equipment which the money would be used to buy includes jerseys, trousers, pucks, helmets, body armour and other protective clothing. The total cost of the equipment is £6,578 of which the application is asking for £4,998 (75%). The remaining funds would be covered by the club's fundraising activities.

Councillor Norris is supportive of the bid as Chairman of Portchester CATs Area. Councillors Bell, Trott and Walker are also supportive of the bid. Councillor Whittle was contacted about the bid but did not respond.

Recommendation:
