We have considered the impact of the proposed variation which allows for an extension of the terminal trading hour by one hour on Thursday, Friday and Saturdays to 2am, closing 2.30 am. We are also seeking to amend and add non-standard timings and remove an outdated condition following consultation with the Police Licensing Officer.

Given the changes proposed, the applicant has carefully considered the application, the effect on the licensing objectives and the Council's Licensing Policy. Steps have been taken to ensure that the application and proposed operation will continue to promote the licensing objectives. In particular, we have undertaken pre consultation regarding the extension of hours proposed with the Police Licensing Officer (PC Jason Pearce), Environmental Health Officer (Craig Perkins) and the Licensing Authority prior to submission of the application. Their comments have been taken into account in considering and submitting this application.

With regard to terminal hours sought through this application, the premises already operates under existing permissions to trade to the hours sought (albeit these are non-standard timings for notable days) and has operated Temporary Event Notices to the later hour sought, and has done so whilst continuing to promote the licensable objectives, without any issues of note and which have not had a negative impact on the Licensing Objectives. The applicant feels the extension of the terminal hour for licensable activities and opening hours will ensure customers can stay in a well-managed, controlled and supervised environment premises for longer, if they wish, and that the later hours will allow a longer wind down period and a more gradual dispersal of customers from the premises, which can be managed and contained, reducing impact on the area and licensing objectives by a mass dispersal at any one time.

Stonegate are a well experienced licensed operator with over 700 sites across the country, and have in place an extensive licensing manual containing policies and procedures across the whole estate, which are adapted at site level to ensure the premises operates to the highest standard and promotes the Licensing Objectives. These include policies regarding social responsibility, training and underage sales and challenge policies, incident logs and, queuing policy, drugs and dispersal policy and noise management and management of outside areas policies as well as procedures to prevent crime and disorder and public nuisance. These robust policies and procedures that are already in place will continue to operate if the application is granted.

Considering the above, we believe that the variation application will not undermine the licensing objectives. The applicant believes that the existing operating schedule conditions, along with the existing policies and measures in place and experience of the operator (including operating to the hours proposed) will ensure the premises continue to promote the licensing objectives if this extension of hours is granted, and no further conditions are necessary.

 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
