YOUR COMMENTS ON THE CASE

There is without doubt overwhelming objections to the erection of houses in the strategic gap between Gosport and Fareham. Any additional houses in this gap will have a detrimental effect on the people of Gosport whereas those in Fareham will only receive the benefit - more Council Tax. Gosport residents will even suffer more traffic delays, and a drain on infrastructure facilities such as schools and health services.
