Further to your letter dated 30 July 2021, and our telephone conversation today, I write to follow up that for health reasons I will not be able to attend the hearing on 24 August 2021.

To respond to your clarification questions I would comment as follows:

1 and 2. I am not sure what effective limitations you could put on music that is outside in terms of noise levels, which is my main concern. As for duration and frequency, I have already been aware of pub noise on occasions and I would not want to put up with this any more frequently than I do already in the interests of compromise and community.

In context, nowhere is free of noise nuisance any more, be it low flying planes circling from Deadelus, or neighbour dogs or children, or building works, or 'boy racer' cars and bikes late at night etc, so the noise from the pub is not heard in a vacuum, especially in the summer. I am sure you are aware of the impact of ambient noise levels on mental and physical health.

3. I have first hand evidence of noise nuisance in the form of amplified live music from the pub regularly but not frequently over the past few years, but did not anticipate having to complain so have not kept a record.

I understand that the pub, like everyone has had a rough year and I wish them the best, but believe they have the facilities to do other things that are less disruptive to recoup lost profit.
