I do know some of the ins and outs of the historic planning applications for this site and surely the only real problem in all of this is the lack of parking and if Hampshire County Council was to allow some of the derelict land behind the building to be used as a car park then all of the problems would disappear. A facility that gives such a useful and necessary service should not be destroyed because of a possible breach of planning rules, after all, Fareham Borough Council have been aware of this development from day one and have had many, many chances to step in and stop it long before it got this far.
